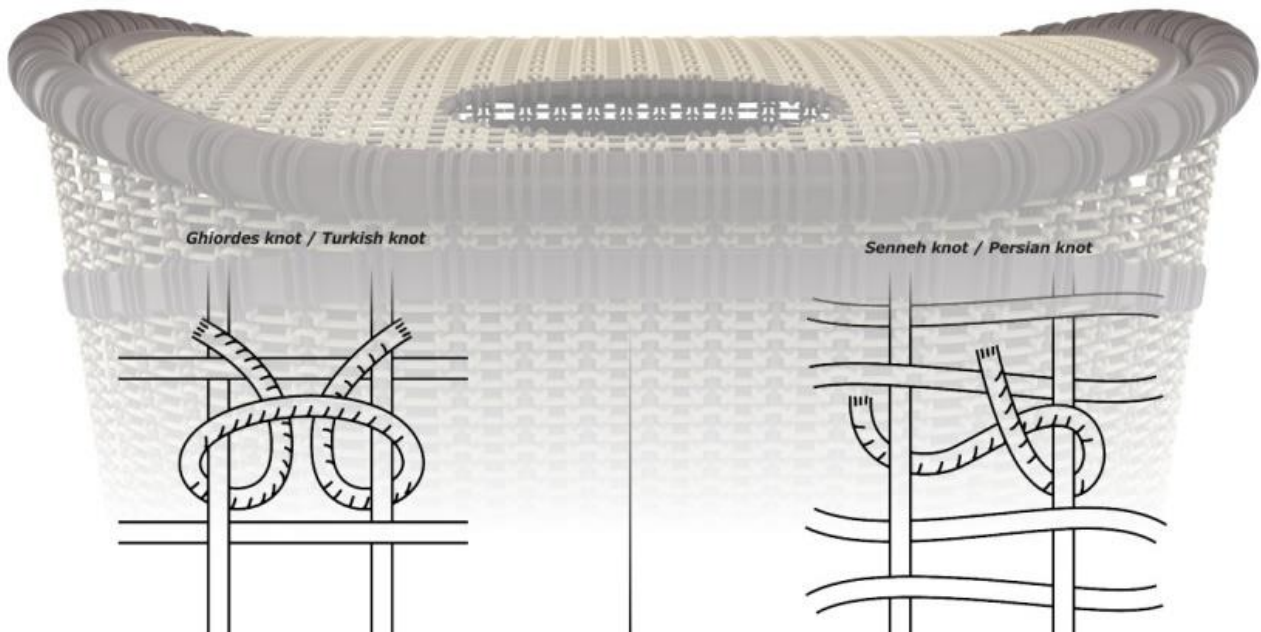
The **Goerdes Laundry Set** consists of two pieces: The hamper and the basket. Their surface details are made of a unique knot detail, inspired of the Turkish knot which is born in Goerdes, a small village in Aegean region of Anatolia.

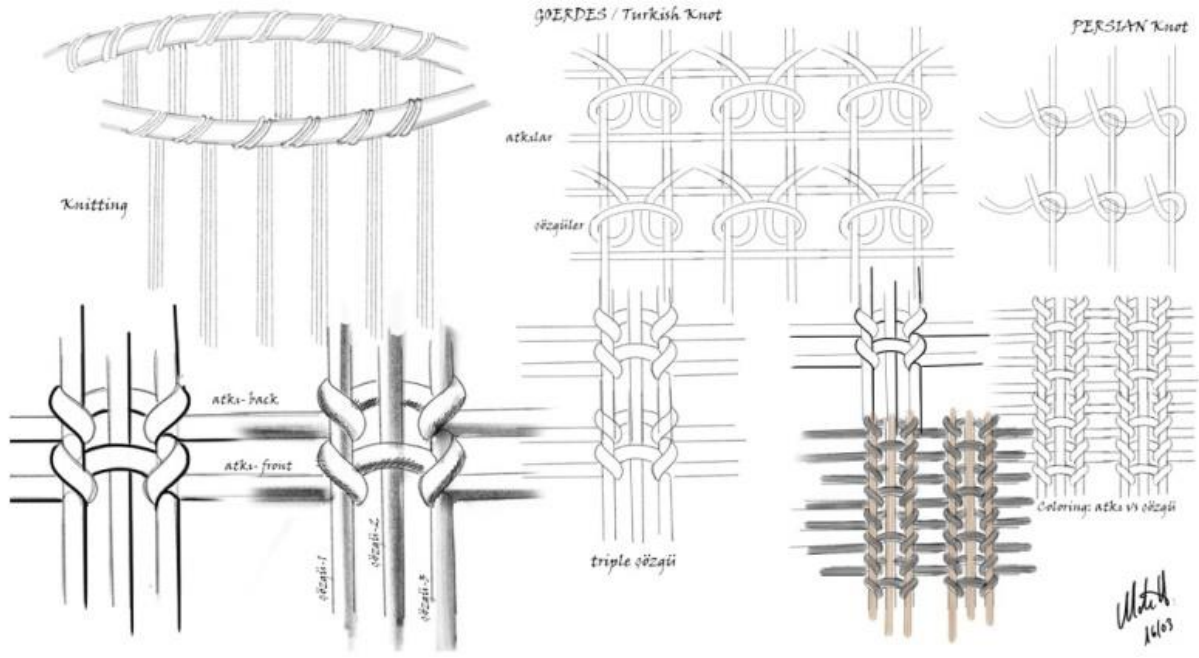
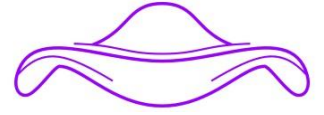


The Goerdes knot or Turkish knot is one of the two most-used knots employed in knotted-pile carpets. (The other is the Seneh knot, typical of Persian carpets.) In the Goerdes knot, the colored weft yarn passes over the two warp yarns, and is pulled through between them and then cut to form the pile. The Goerdes knot has a symmetrical structure. The Goerdes knot is the knot used in the oldest surviving pile carpets, the fragments found in Pazyryk kurgan burial mounds, in the Altai of Central Asia.
